As we look at the beginning of a new school year, it is also time to get Youth Group up and running again with new officers in place. The first meeting of the New Year will be September 8th. At this meeting we will do election of officers and start talking about what we want to do over this coming year.

Higher Things

This year's Higher Things Conference was an adventure. Monday was a full 24hrs + long; with us leaving the church around 2 am and not getting back to the campus and our rooms until after 2 am Tuesday morning. We flew out from Portland and into John Wayne with a plane transfer and layover in San Jose. Upon arrival at John Wayne we had to get to the rental place, where we rented two mini-vans. After picking up our rental cars, we went to Concordia University, Irvine, CA where we tried to check-in, but they weren't ready for us to check in. So we got in contact with Maggie, and she allowed us to put our stuff in her room and agreed to check us in. Finally, we went to Disneyland and California Disney Adventure until the parks closed. While we were enjoying ourselves at the Disneyland Parks, Maggie nicely checked us in and moved all of our luggage from her room to my room so that it was more centrally located when we got back.

Tuesday started a little earlier than normal because we had to make sure to get the vans back within 24 hours so we didn't have to pay for more than one day. We got together and went out to breakfast at IHOP around 9:30, and then we took the youth back to the campus before Pastor and I took the minivans back. Then Pastor got us an Uber back to the campus. Once back at the campus, I meet up with Rachel, and she and I went to the Leaders Meeting. Then we meant up with the rest of the group for opening Divine Service at

2, thus officially kicking off the Higher Things week.

Higher Things week is a very packed week of worship services, classes/catechesis study, and fun. There are two worship services on Tuesday plus Compline at the end of the day, three worship services on Wednesday and Thursday plus Compline at the end of each day, and two more services on Friday – including the closing Divine Service.

Each of the four days there is a Plenary speaker who talks to the youth about the topic of the year. This year's topic was Concordia. There are also several Breakaway Sessions throughout the week where the youth are encouraged to read through the descriptions and choose one at each time slot that they find interesting.

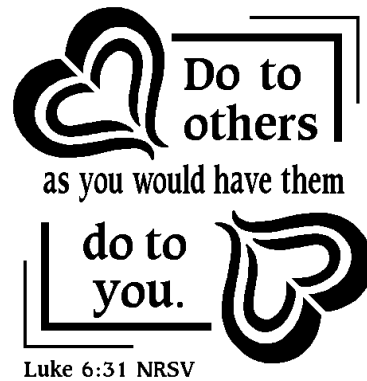
Each evening there is also a good selection of free time activities that the youth are allowed to choose from. We encourage our youth to stay in pairs but to go out, have fun and mingle. On Thursday evening, we got to have free ice cream because the Tetromorph which we belonged to for friendly competition had won. Then we went to a fun park and played a half game of mini golf as a group.

Friday evening was another day full of adventure. We got to the airport by way of Uber, got through security, ordered some dinner, and then the fun really began – the airport lost power. It turns out that the airport and Irvine had lost power due to a fire near a substation. Well, no power and no idea when power would be restored led to the cancelation of all flights into and OUT of John Wayne airport. The question now was what to do for the night and making sure everyone was scheduled for a new flight. Pastor was able to use his network of pastors, to get us into a church for the evening and everyone had been rebooked on flights some leaving Saturday and some Sunday. Saturday morning found us back at the airport, now with power though, where Pastor was able to work it out for everyone to get on a flight Saturday. Most of the group would be flying to Portland with a layover/plane transfer in Las Vegas. There were 4 of us that were getting to Portland via a layover/plane transfer in San Jose. Though we were on different flights we were all due in Portland about the same time. However,

the adventure was not over the 4 flying through San Jose ended up with a significant delay in San Jose. The delay was such that by the time we heard from the other group that they had arrived in Portland, the group in San Jose had still not seen their plane. Finally, our plane got into San Jose and we were able to get on it and fly into Portland, arriving in Portland just after midnight. The parents of the youth I had with me in San Jose met us at the airport to pick up their youth.

As you can see, and probably have heard, this year's Higher Things Conference was an interesting one, full of new adventures. I am hoping to get the youth that went to the conference this year to do write-ups for publishing in the newsletter, but I encourage you to talk to the youth about their experience. 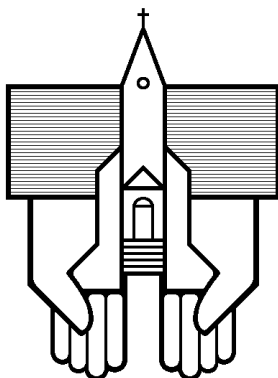

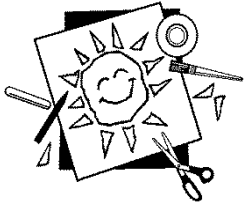

Preschool News

As the newsletter is being written we still have openings available for this year's class!

Preschool Open House will be on Thursday, September 5th from 9:30am to 11:00am. I delivered an envelope with forms to be completed and information about our class when I made home visits. (If I have not contacted you or completed your home visit yet, don't panic! I will. The Sept Newsletter often comes out before I have done the home visits and contacted everyone.) Please bring the completed forms to the Open House, especially the Certificate of Immunization Status card (the information you need is right on your child's immunization card from your physician, some physicians' offices will even print it out for you. I will accept that Certificate of Immunization Status card printed from them, it looks just like the one I gave to you). We **MUST** have that Certificate of Immunization Status card filled out for your child to start preschool.

Also, please bring your child's emergency kit and extra clothing to the open house. That way we can have everything labeled and placed where it needs to be on the first day of preschool. If you can't come to open house, you can drop your paperwork off by the church office. I like to have everything turned in at open house or a day or two before the first day, so that on the first day of preschool when your child may be nervous about being left alone with us, we can give all of our attention to their needs and not administrative tasks.

During the Open House, you and your child can explore our classroom, make their placemat for snack time, and listen to a story about Chester Raccoon's first day of school. If I haven't already; we will be taking your child's picture that day to place on your child's coat & backpack hook, book pocket and placemat before the first day of school.

The first day of class will be on Tuesday, September 10th. Please try to arrive by 9:00am so that we may have structured class activities started by 9:10am. We open the doors at 8:50 am for students to be checked in and have a period of

adjustment before we start our day. Please note: the first week of class we will dismiss at 11:00 am.

Book orders may be brought to class or completed online. The order forms were in the packet of information that was delivered in August. The first book order is due Tuesday, September 17th.

I hope everyone had a wonderful summer. I am looking forward to seeing everyone at open house if not before!

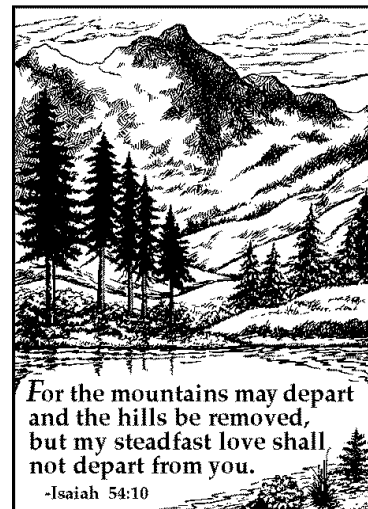
Digital Peace
