Pastoral Care and Visitation

What is pastoral care? That is, what should we expect of our pastor when we're sick, hospitalized, unable to attend church, or in spiritual distress? In every time of need, we can and should receive the Word of God individually from our pastor to comfort us when we are troubled by our sins, to strengthen us when we struggle in this life, and to give us counsel and guidance from God's Word. Your pastor cares for each of our members, not only through the public preaching and teaching of the Word of God, but also by bringing that Word into our homes, when we are hospitalized or homebound, or when our conscience is burdened by sorrow, grief, or shame.

Lutherans have a long tradition of pastoral care and visitation. Lutheran Pastors are known for making visits both in emergency cases and in non-emergency cases or 'just because.' They show care by 'being there' but even more so by 'being there with Jesus.' They bring Christ to the situation. Baptism, Absolution, the Word, and the Lord's Supper are all tools of pastoral care, ways in which pastoral care is rendered to the individual person. Prayer based upon the Scriptures begs God to be present. Psalms speak to all conditions of life in this fallen world. These are the things pastors bring to souls in distress. That is pastoral care.

Visiting you is not a burden. It is not 'Just one more thing to add to Pastor's busy schedule.' It is one of the chief things I ought to be busy doing, and it is, in fact, one of the greatest joys of ministry. It is what I have been called to do in the most basic sense. It is why I am here. I am more than happy to visit when you are sick or hospitalized; before and/or after surgery; or 'just because.'

If ever there is a time you would like your pastor to visit, for whatever reason, just give me a call (either at the church office or at my home) and we can set up a time for me to come visit.
