Then you shall know that I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will do it, declares the LORD."

But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."

I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life


