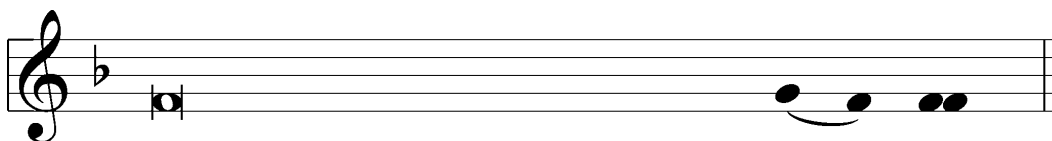
THE WORDS OF OUR LORD
